

- Added an additional yoga instructor, Kenneth, and are beginning to add weekday classes. Both morning and early evening.
- Expanded the gym by converting the community room into a spin and cycle studio.
- The gym has been reorganized to provide more floor space and the MFC has purchased two echo assault bikes and more adjustable benches.
- There are plans (hopefully in 2024) to purchase leg extension and hamstring curl machines. This is part of the upcoming budget discussions.
- Reminder the MFC is a non-profit facility. In-kind donations of designated gear, or monetary donations, will be put directly into the facility, just as the proceeds from memberships are. Help us support our athletes, veterans and community.

MINTURN MARKET UPDATE:

- A Minturn Market visioning committee was formed this year, to assist with vendor recruitment and creative input / brainstorming.
- 2 theme markets were held this summer—a Father's Day Market on June 17th and a "Makers Market" on June 24th. The regular market season ran July 1st through September 2nd.
- A KIDS ZONE was created at this year's market, including a climbing wall, bounce house, mechanical bull, face painting, and a build-your-own stuffed animal station. The Market will also host kids storytimes during the regular peak season, featuring readings by local children's authors.
- Marketing efforts were also being increased this year. Marketing efforts now include all of the following: Vail Daily (print and online), KZYR radio ads and twice monthly interviews, Radio Free Minturn announcements, Vail bus ads (inside), Vail parking structure digital ads, On-site Digital Network kiosks (in area hotels and at Eagle County Airport), and Vail Valley Live (in addition to social media efforts).
